VASECTOMY

VASECTOMY is a simple, safe, and effective surgical procedure that makes a male sterile (unable to father a child). A vasectomy should be considered irreversible and is a serious step to take. You and your partner should share in this permanent decision.

Instructions Pre-procedure:

- 1. It is okay to drink or eat a light meal prior to your procedure.
- 2. If you take blood pressure medication, heart pills, etc. you may take prior to this procedure.
- 3. If you take ANTIBIOTICS prior to dental work or have an orthopedic prosthesis, or if you were told by another physician to take antibiotics prior to surgery, please call the office.
- 4. Coumadin, Aspirin, Ibuprofen, or Drugs for Arthritis or Inflammation must be discontinued 1 week prior to surgery.
- 5. It is necessary for you to purchase scrotal support or athletic supporter from your local drug store prior to procedure.

THE MORNING OF PROCEDURE: Make sure you bring the scrotal support on the day of procedure.

Instructions Post-procedure:

DIET: 1. You will have no dietary restrictions.

- **ACTIVITY:** 1. It is okay to shower within 24 hours, no bathing/swimming for 7 days. You can return to sexual activity when you feel ready.
 - 2. No heavy lifting or strenuous exercise for one week.

PAIN MEDICATION: You will be given a prescription for pain medication. Take as needed. You may also take Tylenol as needed, but NO ASPIRIN. No Alcohol.

INCISION CARE:

- 1. Apply ice to surgical area day of procedure. (wrap ice in gauze or cloth. Do not apply directly to skin)
- 2. Wear the scrotal support for one week. You will experience some discomfort, redness, swelling and bruising this is all normal.

SEXUAL ACTIVITY: Use birth control until having 2 negative semen analyses (office will notify you).

Post vasectomy Patients need to call office to confirm that the physician is in the office before dropping samples. First sample will be 1 month after procedure. Second sample 3 months after procedure.
